OBJECTIVES

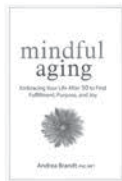

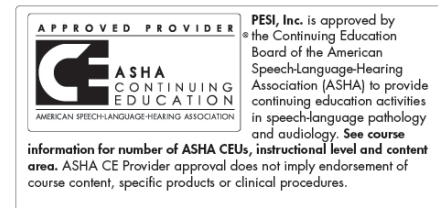
