Prior to this, Dr. Carter served as a senior assistant research scientist in the Epidemic Intelligence Service of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. He has been a psychotherapist and researcher for more than 20 years, during which time he has garnered awards from the National Institutes of Health, the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute, and the University of Michigan. In addition to his teaching and research, Dr. Carter is actively engaged in translating psychology to everyday language. He has also appeared in magazines such as *Mental Floss* and *Reader’s Digest*, as well as in news programs such as *Connect with Kids* and NBC’s “Today Show.” Dr. Carter recently published *Learn Psychology*, an introductory psychology textbook, with Dr. Colleen Seifert of the University of Michigan.

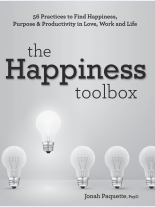
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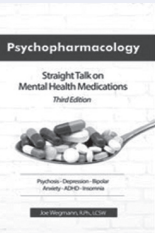
