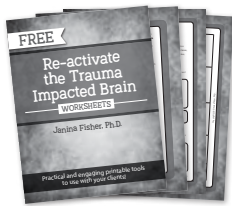

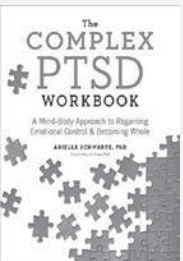
OBJECTIVES

- 1. Analyze the brain regions involved in trauma.

- 3. Establish how clinicians can assess for simple, complex, and intergenerational trauma.
- 4. Characterize how bottom-up techniques like grounding and breathwork can increase felt safety in clients.
- 5. Specify methods clinicians can use to gauge when clients are ready for intense trauma work.
- 6. Explore how narrative therapy exercises can be employed in session to help clients talk about hotspots.
- 7. Specify how somatic approaches can be used to address the physical symptoms of trauma survivors.

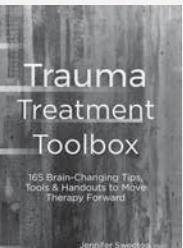
- 8. Establish how exposure, titration and pendulation can be used to “slow” emotions in clients.
